The opportunities they lost in the closing months of the Second World War led to the thirty year colonial and civil war in Indo-China. A fortnight before, 29 April 1975, the war had ended with the fall of Saigon and the American humiliation which we had predicted exactly ten years before, 29 April 1965, when Menzies had first announced the Australian combat commitment. This book itself was of great value to me thirty years later when I came to write "Churchill and Australia" and was able to correct several mis-statements by both Churchill and Roosevelt regarding the Prime Ministership of the great John Curtin.
