Worldwide certification for the Adelaide Zero Project!

Through the Adelaide Zero Project, Adelaide is now the first city outside of North America to be officially certified for its homelessness data!

To secure certification, the Adelaide Zero Project met 29 requirements set out by Community Solutions, a US based organisation helping communities around the world end homelessness.

The certification means the Adelaide Zero Project has officially achieved quality data in its By-Name List.






